




#### **Volunteers in Transition**




### **Honoring the Gift of Life Wall**

St. Cloud Hospital's "Honoring the Gift of Life" wall, located in the north hallway on the first floor of St. Cloud Hospital, honors and pays tribute to organ, tissue and/or eye donors who gave the gifts of life and/or sight at St. Cloud Hospital.

Hundreds of guests, including families of donors, attended an unveiling and dedication ceremony April 29, 2015. The ceremony included a brief program and blessing by Bishop Donald Kettler.

The "Honoring the Gift of Life" wall display is a nature-themed mosaic designed and created by local artists. An interactive computer kiosk allows users to view tributes and photos of donors. The wall provides education to patients, families and visitors about the importance of organ, tissue and eye donation. We hope that by honoring our donors, we can pay tribute to their legacy and encourage others to consider organ, tissue and eye donation.

### **Empowerment Through Beauty**

Many adolescent Behavioral Health clients come into treatment looking on the outside how they feel in the inside — disheveled, depressed, anxious, sad, mad and scared. As clients start to heal, dealing with their emotions instead of covering them up, their physical appearance improves.

Clients are taught good eating habits, exercise and personal hygiene. Empowerment Through Beauty provides clients with a salon visit to help clients get healthier during their treatment.

By taking them to a salon for haircuts, manicures or pedicures, they have more confidence and self-esteem. Clients see cutting their hair as symbolic of making changes, of a fresh beginning and new chapter in their life.



Earlier and more frequent monitoring of newborns for jaundice in the Family Birthing Center has caused an increased demand for use of phototherapy. BiliSoft blankets allow parents to hold and feed their infants during treatment. The older method requires placing babies in a crib under lights. Through additional funding, two more blankets will be purchased to allow more parents to use the preferred method. Through early intervention and consistent use, the phototherapy decreases length of stay.

# **Chemotherapy Companion Guide** and Inspire book

Patients undergoing chemotherapy need emotional support and guidance along their cancer journey. The Chemotherapy Companion Guide supports patients by providing information in easy to understand terms using pictures and words to explain different side effects. The "Inspire" book, written by a cancer survivor, shares inspirational messages with patients and families.
