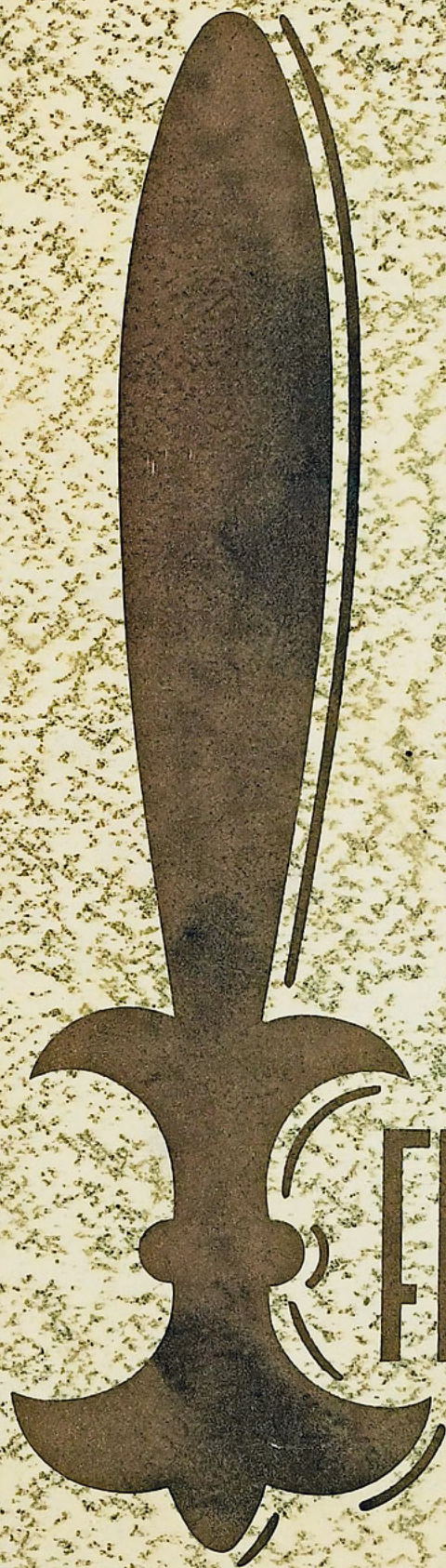

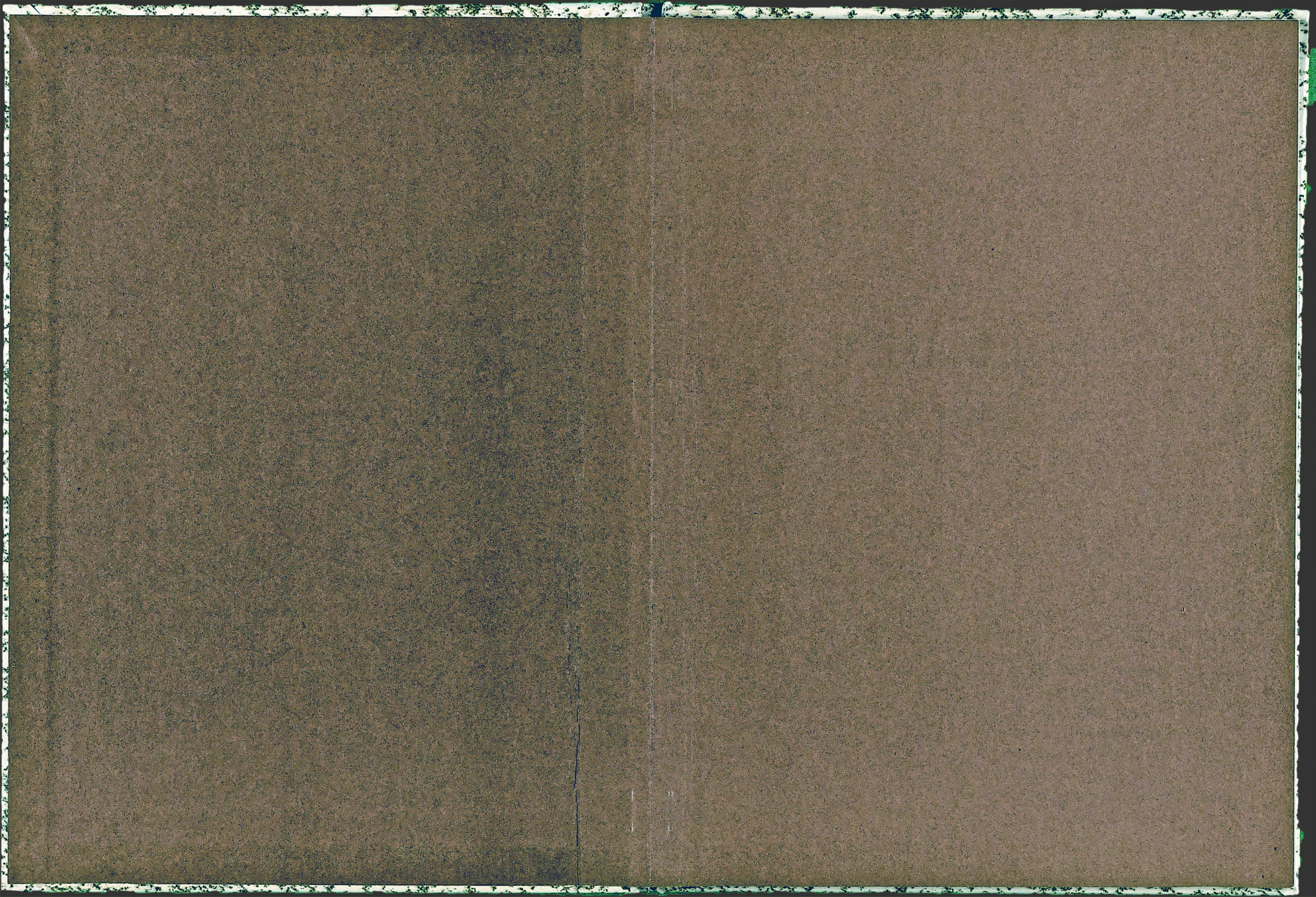

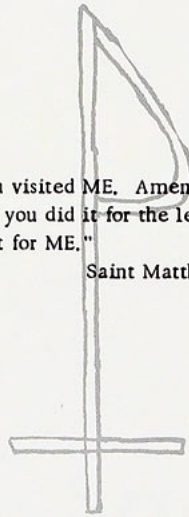

For these reasons we think Doctor P. L. Halenbeck is helping us to attain our goal, the care of the sick as graduate nurses, and we shall always gratefully remember him.

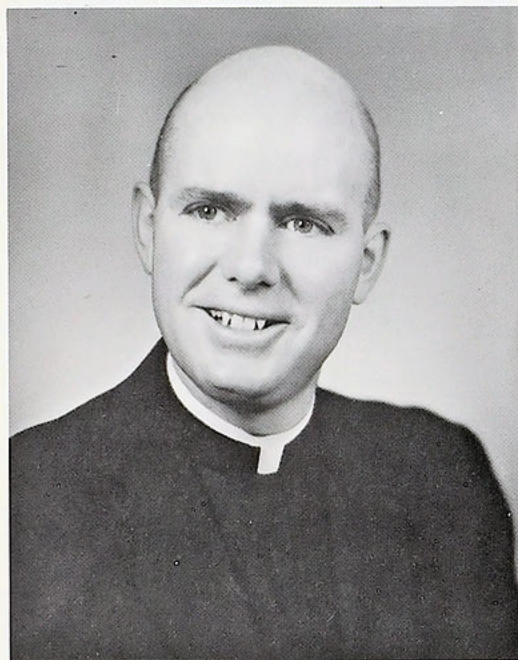

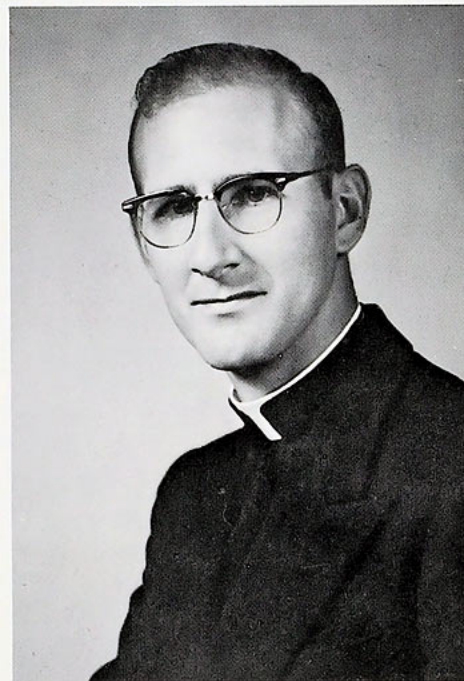
## CHAPLAINS . . .

No matter what road each individual chooses, we will be taking with us the Christian philosophy that has been instilled within us during our years of education and training. 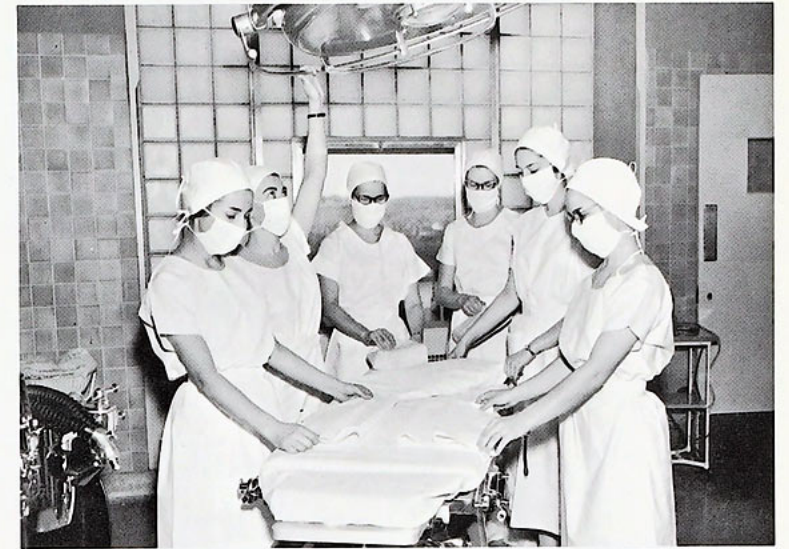

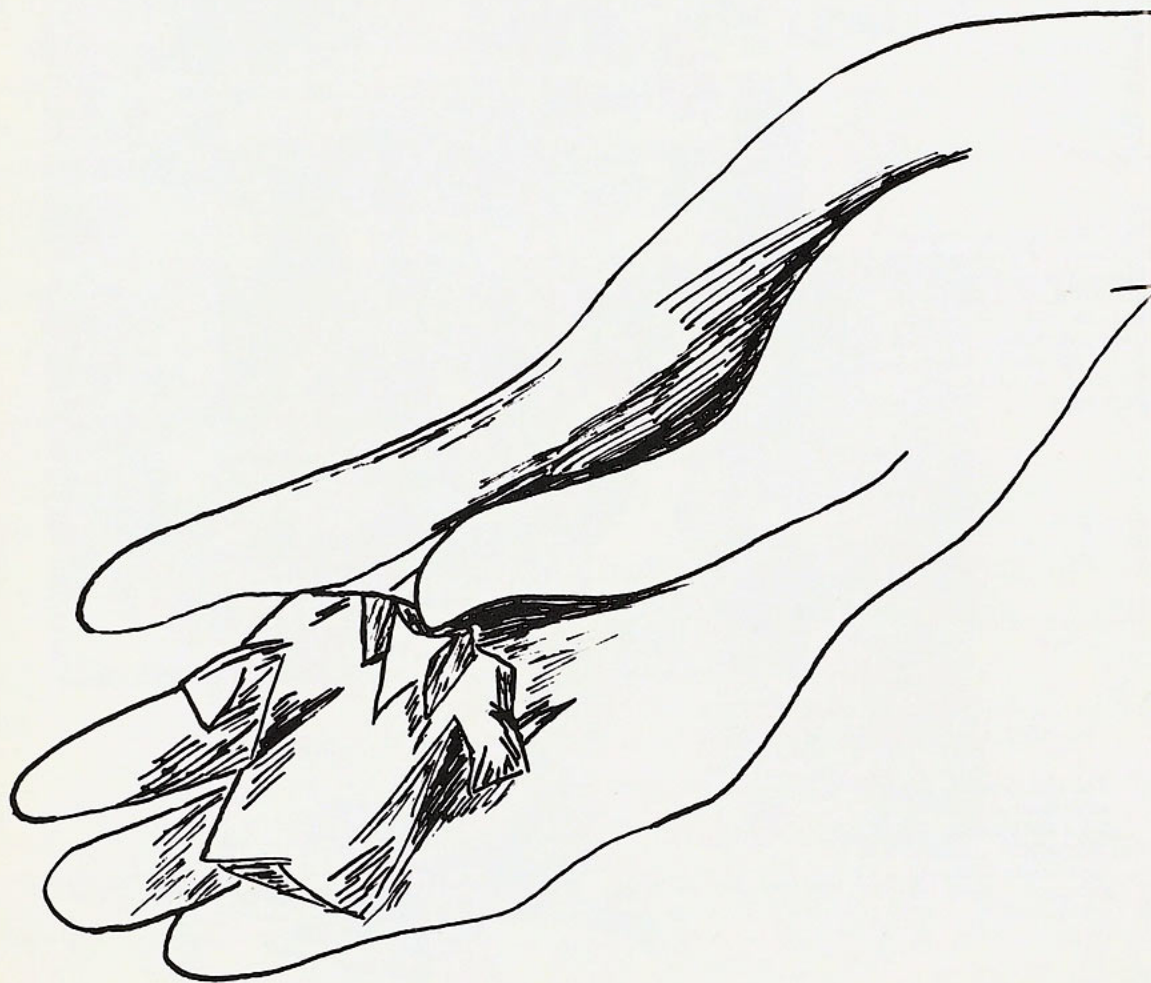
