### An award for one is an honor for all of us



Dear Friends:

Each of us who works for CentraCare Health System has reason to celebrate this spring. As members of the CentraCare team, we can share in St. Cloud Hospital's recent awards.

St. Cloud Hospital is in the nation's 100 Top Hospitals for the fourth consecutive year. This is the seventh time the hospital has made the list since the awards program started in 1993. Thomson Reuters, the organization that runs the top 100 program, analyzes data in nine categories to make its rankings. The categories include patient safety, average length of stay, patient satisfaction, medical complications, mortality, adherence to clinical standards, expenses, profitability and cash-to-debt ratio.

Not only is St. Cloud Hospital in the top 100, it is one of only 23 hospitals in the country (and the only one in Minnesota) to win the Everest Award. That honor goes to an elite group of top 100 hospitals that have shown the fastest rates of improvement over the past five years.

The hospital also earned, for the eighth time, top 100 heart hospital status this past fall.

Just a few weeks before winning a spot in the top 100, St. Cloud Hospital was re-designated as a Magnet hospital for nursing excellence. The Magnet criteria are so rigorous that only 2 percent of hospitals achieve re-designation. Magnet recognizes not only nursing, but also the collaboration between nursing and all other disciplines within the hospital.

St. Cloud Hospital also recently was named one of America's Best Hospitals for urology and orthopedics. This honor comes from *U.S. News & World Report*.

We all can feel proud to be part of a health system that provides, to our patients, the best quality outcomes at the lowest cost.
