Free colon cancer screening project a success

Nearly 500 Central Minnesotans picked up free colon cancer screening kits in March. This screening resulted in 32 positive findings for blood in participants' stools with 12 participants receiving colonoscopies. Three of these 32 participants were found to have a type of polyp that potentially could result in cancer. One participant was diagnosed with early stage rectal cancer and another with esophageal cancer. When colorectal cancer is found early and treated, the five-year relative survival rate is 90 percent.
